Research topic

The Spring School is a hybrid of research and teaching. It will bring together internationally renowned scholars, early-career researchers, and students to address a highly relevant topic in an interactive, international, and interdisciplinary setting:

What role does (criminal) law play in the Anthropocene, i.e., in an era in which humanity has become a geophysical force?

The Anthropocene describes not only ecological crises, but also a profound shift in the conditions under which law functions at all. Climate collapse, biodiversity loss, and planetary tipping points are undermining classic legal distinctions: between action and structure, between individual guilt and systemic causation, between local offenses and planetary impact.

The Spring School takes these shifts seriously – not abstractly, but at the core of criminal law. It brings together criminal law dogmatics, critical theory, environmental research, and political ecology. The goal is not a finished model, but a more precise understanding of where criminal law reaches its limits today – and where it needs to be reimagined.




